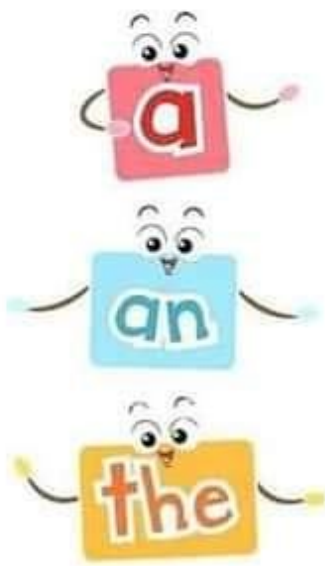

What is an article?



an article is an adjective.
articles modify nouns.

English has 2 articles

The
definite article

used to refer to specific
or particular nouns

For example,

if I say, "Let's read the book,"
I mean a specific book.



used before singular and plural
nouns when the noun is specific
or particular.

the man, the cats, the pen,
the bags

A/An
indefinite article

used to modify non-specific
or non-particular nouns.

For example,

If I say, "Let's read a book,"
I mean any book rather than
a specific book.



a + singular noun beginning
with a consonant

a boy, a car, a bike

an + singular noun beginning
with a vowel

an elephant, an egg, an apple

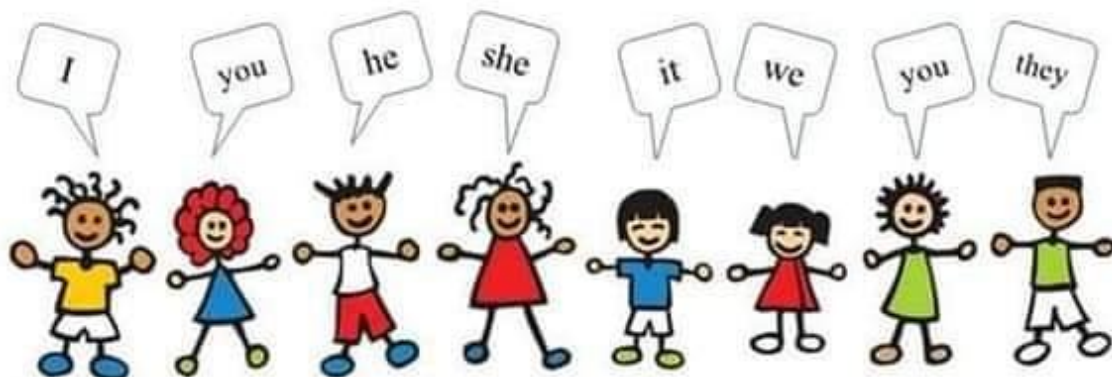

Affirmative



I + am



He
She + is
It

It is an apple.

He is happy.

I am a boy.



Negative



am
+ is + not
are

Example:

She is not a doctor.

They are not reading.

It is not my pet.

I am not in the house.



Interrogative

are



Example:

Is he an engineer?

Am I Driving too fast?

Are you going home now?

Are they excited about the party?

Contractions

is not = isn't

She is not my friend.



are not = aren't

They are not coming today.
