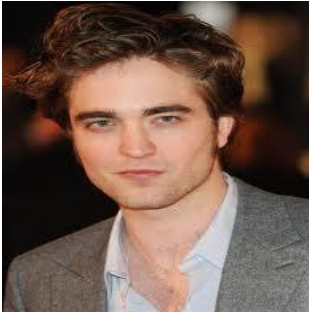


A. Reading comprehension (6 Marks)

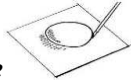
